- Ch 1: Parts of a Sentence – sentence vs. fragment, simple and complete subjects, simple and complete predicates, and types of sentences – (declarative, imperative, interrogative, exclamatory).
- Ch 2 and Ch 3: Parts of Speech (noun, pronoun, adjective, verb, adverb, preposition, conjunction, interjection).
- Ch 4: Complements (direct objects, indirect objects, predicate nominative, predicate adjective)
